This Sunday we celebrate The First Sunday in Advent.

In the present, as we walk hopefully through this troubled world, we hear prophecies from the past about the Messiah's coming while we wait for Christ's second coming in the future when the whole world will be made whole; one day the wolf will lie down with the lamb, death will be swallowed up, and every tear will be wiped away.

Today, we also celebrate together the **Sacrament of Holy Communion**. Everyone is welcome to join us to share the Lord's Supper.
