Good morning and welcome to everyone who has joined us at St. Ninian's this morning. We hope you will enjoy our worship of God together today. As a congregation our mission is to 'Worship God together, encourage personal faith and prayer, spread the Good News about Jesus Christ, and love and care for others in our community.' If you are a visitor, there is a visitors' book at the front door, please sign it. After the service we have fellowship in the Martin Shields' Hall, please join us.

For young people, there is a **crèche** and **Sunday School** this morning. The reader this morning is: **Suzanne Hope**. The organist is **Anne Kirkpatrick**. Leading worship is the **Rev. James Aitken**.

This Sunday is **Trinity** Sunday. Although every Christian worship service is a celebration of the Trinity, Trinity Sunday focuses explicitly on God as three-in-one, Father, Son and Spirit. Whereas other liturgical services are tied to specific events (Christmas, Easter, Pentecost), this celebration is linked to a doctrine, which is summary of scriptural teaching about God's being. Following the Easter Season, the Church traditionally celebrates the Trinity on the Sunday after Pentecost.

Following worship there is fellowship, friendship, and refreshments in the Martin Shields' Hall. Please join us.

St. Ninian's uses the Revised Common Lectionary which is an approved week-by-week, threeyear cycle of biblical readings. In 2024 we are in Year B and the principal Gospel readings come from the **Gospel of Mark**. The readings lead us from Advent through the Christian year, the Bible, and Jesus' life through birth, baptism, his public ministry, his death, resurrection and ascension.

<u>ENTRANCE</u>

The service begins with a **sentence from the Bible** (2 Cor 13: 14), a **call to stand** (please do so if you are able to), an **introit** from the choir, and the **entrance of the Bible**. For the rest of the service the words in bold are read or sung by everyone. We sit to pray and stand to sing.
