

Good morning and welcome to everyone who has joined us at St. Ninian's this morning. We hope you will enjoy our worship of God together today. As a congregation our mission is to 'Worship God together, encourage personal faith and prayer, spread the Good News about Jesus Christ, and love and care for others in our community.' If you are a visitor, there is a visitors' book at the front door, please sign it.

The season of **Easter** begins today. The Easter morning service is a time of joy, celebration, and renewal as all the hopes and expectations of Christians are realised in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, and his ongoing life in the world through the Church, his resurrected body on earth today. Easter morning is only the first of 50 days of **Eastertide** that lead to Pentecost (this year on the 19<sup>th</sup> of May). Eastertide is a season of extended celebration exploring the ramifications of Jesus' resurrection for the redemption of all creation, and for joyful Christian living.

Before the service there is weekly a **Prayer Group** that meets in Room 6 (the Alpha Room) from 10:00am – 10:15am. Everyone is welcome, please ask a steward for Room 6, the Alpha Room.

There is no Sunday School or creche this morning, but children are welcome in the service. During the service they are free to use the resources that will be provided. The reader this morning is **Andrew Gibb**. The organist is **Anne Kirkpatrick**. Leading worship is the **Rev. James Aitken** and **Emma McMillan**, our ministry student.

Following worship there is **fellowship**, **friendship**, **and refreshments** in the Martin Shields' Hall. Please join us.

St. Ninian's uses the Revised Common Lectionary which is an approved week-by-week three-year cycle of biblical readings. In 2025 we are in Year C and the principal Gospel readings come from the **Gospel of Luke**. The readings lead us from Advent through the Christian year, the Bible, and Jesus' life through birth, baptism, his public ministry, his death, resurrection and ascension.

#### **ENTRANCE**

The service begins with a **sentence from the Bible** (Matthew 15: 26), a **call to stand** (please do so if you are able to), an **introit** from the choir, and the **entrance of the Bible**. For the rest of the service the words in bold are read or sung by everyone. We sit to pray and stand to sing.

#### INVITATION & CONFESSION OF FAITH

Minister:

release resurrection in the world.

#### PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING & NARRATIVE OF THE INSTITUTION

Minister: The Lord be with you.

Congregation: And also with you.

Minister: Lift up your hearts.

Congregation: We lift them to the Lord.

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Congregation: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Minister: Loving God, you made this world lovely for us to enjoy. You told

us that Jesus is our friend, and that his life shows us how to live our lives. The Spirit of his life lives on amongst us today, making us one body in Jesus Christ, the Church. For sharing your world with us we say thank you, and we join together with your people of

all places and all times in this joyful hymn of praise,

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth

are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who

comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Minister: Loving God, thank you for Jesus' birth; his life on earth; his

suffering for us; and this morning thank you for his triumph over death. His life and his message were not defeated by death, but are vindicated in the ongoing life of his church. As an act of memorial to him and as a sign of his ongoing, resurrected, life we follow his command when on the night of his arrest, taking bread, he broke it and gave thanks to God, saying, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in memory of me." In the same way, he took the cup after supper, saying: "This cup is the new covenant sealed by my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this in

memory of me."

Lord God move us with a spirit of holiness so that when these gifts of bread and wine are consumed by us, this bread, which we break, may be a symbol of the communion of the body of Christ, and this cup, which we drink, a symbol of the communion of the blood of Christ. So Christ is resurrected in our time. May the body and blood of Christ nourish us and help us to grow in faith to the glory of your most holy name.

All: Christ has died.

Christ has risen.

Christ will come again.
