Good morning and welcome to everyone who has joined us at St. Ninian's this morning. We hope you will enjoy our worship of God together today. As a congregation our mission is to, 'Worship God together, encourage personal faith and prayer, spread the Good News about Jesus Christ, and love and care for others in our community.' If you are a visitor, there is a visitors' book at the front door, please sign it.

This Sunday is the **Fourth Sunday after Epiphany**. Epiphany means 'manifestation' or 'appearance', and during the season of Epiphany we learn more about the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. This year Epiphany lasts from 12th of January to the 2nd of March.

Before the service there is weekly a **Prayer Group** that meets in Room 6 (the Alpha Room) from 10:00am – 10:15am. Everyone is welcome, please ask a steward for Room 6 Alpha Room.

There is a **crèche** and a primary **Sunday School** this morning. The reader this morning is **Jim Hunter**. The organist is **Anne Kirkpatrick**. Leading worship is the **Emma McMillan**, our ministry student.

Following worship there is **fellowship**, **friendship**, **and refreshments** in the Martin Shields' Hall. Please join us.

St. Ninian's uses the Revised Common Lectionary which is an approved week-by-week three-year cycle of biblical readings. In 2025 we are in Year C and the principal Gospel readings come from the **Gospel of Luke**. The readings lead us from Advent through the Christian year, the Bible, and Jesus' life through birth, baptism, his public ministry, his death, resurrection and ascension.

ENTRANCE

The service begins with a **sentence from the Bible** (Psalm 138: 2), a **call to stand** (please do so if you are able to), an **introit** from the choir, and the **entrance of the Bible**. For the rest of the service the words in bold are read or sung by everyone. We sit to pray and stand to sing.

INTROIT

WELCOME, INTIMATIONS and SHARING OF THE PEACE We welcome one another with Christ's words 'Peace be with you'.

APPROACH TO GOD

CALL TO WORSHIP (incorporating lyrics from Hymn 510)

Leader: Jesus call us here to meet him as,

through word and song and prayer,

Congregation: we affirm God's promised presence

where his people live and care.

Leader: Praise the God who keeps his promise;

praise the Son who calls us friends;

Congregation: praise the spirit who, among us, to our hopes and fears attends.

HYMN 485 Dear Lord and Father of mankind

Written by 19th century American poet John Greenleef Whittier (1807 – 1892), this devotional hymn encourages quiet meditation, and reverential contemplation, in our approach to God this morning.
