Good morning and welcome to everyone who has joined us at St. Ninian's this morning. We hope you will enjoy our worship of God together today. As a congregation our mission is to 'Worship God together, encourage personal faith and prayer, spread the Good News about Jesus Christ, and love and care for others in our community.' If you are a visitor, there is a visitors' book at the front door, please sign it.

This Sunday is **Sanctuary Sunday** (also sometimes called Refugee Sunday), a day when churches around the world remember and pray for refugees and people displaced from their homes. Most of us are no strangers to this topic, as we have witnessed hundreds of thousands of people flee for their lives over the last decade. On Sanctuary Sunday we look to the Scriptures and reflect on how our faith calls us to respond to the needs of refugees, both around the world and those living amongst us.

Before the service there is weekly a **Prayer Group** that meets in Room 6 (the Alpha Room) from 10:00am – 10:15am. Everyone is welcome, please ask a steward for Room 6, the Alpha Room.

There is a **crèche** and both a primary and secondary **Sunday School** this morning. The organist is **Anne Kirkpatrick**. The reader this morning is **Sheonagh Richards**. Leading worship is **Mrs Penni Brown**, our ministry student.

Following worship there is **fellowship**, **friendship**, **and refreshments** in the Martin Shields' Hall. Please join us.

St. Ninian's uses the Revised Common Lectionary which is an approved week-by-week three-year cycle of biblical readings. In 2025 we are in Year C and the principal Gospel readings come from the **Gospel of Luke**. The readings lead us from Advent through the Christian year, the Bible, and Jesus' life through birth, baptism, his public ministry, his death, resurrection and ascension.

## **ENTRANCE**

The service begins with a **sentence from the Bible** (Psalm 42 verse 8), a **call to stand** (please do so if you are able to), an **introit** from the choir, and the **entrance of the Bible**. For the rest of the service the words in bold are read or sung by everyone. We sit to pray and stand to sing.

## **INTROIT**

WELCOME, INTIMATIONS and SHARING OF THE PEACE We welcome one another with Christ's words 'Peace be with you'.

# **APPROACH TO GOD**

CALL TO WORSHIP (using words from Psalm 42)

Leader: Just as the deer pants for running water

All: We thirst for you Lord: the living God

Leader: When shall we come into your presence, Loving God?

All: We march like pilgrims to the house of God

Leader: Even in our distress we will wait for you, Living God

All: We will praise you continually, our deliverer, our God!
