Good morning and welcome to everyone who has joined us at St. Ninian's this morning. We hope you will enjoy our worship of God together today. As a congregation our mission is to 'Worship God together, encourage personal faith and prayer, spread the Good News about Jesus Christ, and love and care for others in our community.' If you are a visitor, there is a visitors' book at the front door, please sign it.

This is the season of **Eastertide**. Easter Sunday is only the first of 50 days (7 Sundays) of **Eastertide** that lead to Pentecost (this year on the 8th of June). Eastertide is a season of extended celebration exploring the ramifications of Jesus' resurrection for the redemption of all creation, and for joyful Christian living.

Before the service there is weekly a **Prayer Group** that meets in Room 6 (the Alpha Room) from 10:00am – 10:15am. Everyone is welcome, please ask a steward for Room 6, the Alpha Room.

During the service, we celebrate the ministry of **St. Ninian's choir**. The choir rehearses weekly on a Thursday evening between September & May. It supports worship through congregational singing, anthems, and introits. This morning, we say thank you to choir members and to Anne, our choir leader and organist, for their contributions and hard work over the past year.

There is a **crèche** and both a primary and secondary **Sunday School** this morning. The organist is **Anne Kirkpatrick**. Leading worship is the **Rev. James Aitken** and **Penni Brown**, our ministry student. The reader is **Jim Hunter**.

Following worship there is **fellowship**, **friendship**, **and refreshments** in the Martin Shields' Hall. Please join us.

St. Ninian's uses the Revised Common Lectionary which is an approved week-by-week three-year cycle of biblical readings. In 2025 we are in Year C and the principal Gospel readings come from the **Gospel of Luke**. The readings lead us from Advent through the Christian year, the Bible, and Jesus' life through birth, baptism, his public ministry, his death, resurrection and ascension.

ENTRANCE

The service begins with a **sentence from the Bible** (Psalm 67: 3 – 4), a **call to stand** (please do so if you are able to), an **introit** from the choir, and the **entrance of the Bible**. For the rest of the service the words in bold are read or sung by everyone. We sit to pray and stand to sing.

WELCOME, INTIMATIONS and SHARING OF THE PEACE We welcome one another with Christ's words 'Peace be with you'.
